SUD 2013 Questions and Answers(the 2nd Round)

Question 1

- 1. For the final presentation, should all of my team members attend, or is it okay to choose one or two members to represent the team?
 - ⇒ It is ok to choose one or two members to represent the team.
- 2. On the website, one of the members of international team will get partial reimbursement. Could you tell me how much that would be?
 - ⇒ We will provide each team from foreign countries with a part of flight and accommodation expenses. Currently, we have a budget of 2,300,000won(KRW) for each team from foreign countries.
- 3. For the second panel requirement, what do you mean by "model images"? Are you saying that the perspective images of the panel two should be bigger than the ones on the panel one? Or the panel two only has to contain perspective images and the panel one should include other things such as the rest of the diagrams, texts, and master plan?
 - ⇒ Model photos means physical model photos.
- 4. How will the panels be displayed when juries see our work? How will the panels be displayed during the presentation?
 - ⇒ The panels will be displayed during the presentation using eagels.
- 5. How big should the presentation sheet be? A4 or bigger? Also, is there any particular version of the Power point we should be using? (Power point 2007 ,2010 etc.) Can the presentation sheet (powerpoint presentation) contain images or should it be only text?
 - ⇒ The presentation sheet can be any size; you only need to make a presentation using the powerpoint.
 The version of the Power point should be 2010 or the lower version.
 The presentation sheet should contain images and text to explain your idea.
- 6. Are we actually going to present in Power Point?
 - → Yes
- 7. When we arrive to Seoul in October, do we have to inform you (or else) that we arrived?
 - \Rightarrow Yes.

Question 2

- 1. About the direction and level of the 2nd round panels
 - Should the design be a realistic approach focusing on details, or an abstract expression developed from the 1st round scheme?
 - ⇒ It is up to entrants. The design can be an abstract expression developed from the 1st round scheme,

but it would be better if it considers the feasibility of the scheme.

- Is it necessary to enlarge the scale of the plan to show the detailed architectural plan?
 - ⇒ It is up to entrants, but it is better to show the details in urban scale instead of architectural scale.
- Is the requirement of '100m length' still valid in the 2nd round submission?
 - ⇒ Yes. The competition site is a freely chosen area of Jemulpo-gil and the adjacent blocks with more than 100m length in east-west direction within the 1st section between *Shinwol* IC and *Mok-dong* bridge.
- 2. About models and panel for models
 - Is the panel for models replace the actual physical model?
 - ⇒ Yes, you don't need to bring the physical model to the presentation.
 - Is the 900*600 panel only for model photos or it can include other plans or diagrams?
 - ⇒ It is up to entrants, but the basic drawings and diagrams should be included in the first panel of 600mm x 1800mm (landscape).
 - Does the model have to be a certain scale or size?
 - \Rightarrow It is up to entrants.
 - Does the model have to have some architectural details, or is it an urban scale mass model?
 - ⇒ It is up to entrants. It is expected to be an urban-scale model.
- 3. Inside the 1800*600 panel, are we allowed to include the same contents in the 1st round submission, or is it something totally new?
 - ⇒ It is up to entrants, but it is expected to see an improved scheme.
- 4. Should the program for the final presentation be PPT? Or it could be other programs such as PDF?
 - ⇒ The presentation material should be MS Powerpoint file. However, if the entrants want to present using another program including video files, it would be fine.

Question 3

About panel production

- 1. In the information on the 2nd round submission, there are two types of panels, 1,800mm*600mm, and 900mm*600mm. Does this mean that the panel should be made in two different types? Or one of them should be chosen?
 - ⇒ The basic instructions for the submission for the 2nd round in the competition brief is as follows.
 - -1 panel (pdf file): 600mm x 1800mm size (landscape)
 - -1 panel of model photos (pdf file): 600mm x 900mm size (landscape), including at least 3 model photos
 - -presentation material (MS Powerpoint file): more than 10 sheets (for 5 min. presentation)

 However, the detailed instructions for the 2^{nd} round can be changed later. In that case, it will

be announced through the website.

- 2. Do we need to print out the panel, or submit in digital files?
 - ⇒ The panel will be printed out by the organizing committee, once submitted in digital file by entrants.
- 3. Is there any format or limitation in making presentation PPT files?
 - ⇒ The presentation material should be more than 10 sheets (for 5 min. presentation)
- 4. It was informed that the 2nd round submission should be made by email. Then, is there any format or method for that?
 - ⇒ The detailed methods for 2nd round submission will be noticed later.

Question 4

1. firstly, I have a few questions regarding the details for the next stage of the competition. As of right now, the information we know are as follows:

One final poster of 600mm X 1800mm landscape

One final poster of 600mm X 1800mm containing model photos

Power point presentation file (at least 5 minutes presentation)

It seems there will be updates on the requirements for the second round (as suggested on the winners announcement web page). In that case, when will it be uploaded? We would like to continue working on the second round as soon as possible as classes are starting very soon and we want to put out our best effort into this competition without being occupied by school projects

- \Rightarrow The basic instructions for the submission for the 2nd round in the competition brief is as follows.
 - -1 panel (pdf file): 600mm x 1800mm size (landscape)
 - -1 panel of model photos (pdf file): 600mm x 900mm size (landscape), including at least 3 model photos
 - -presentation material (MS Powerpoint file): more than 10 sheets (for 5 min. presentation)

If there is any change in the detailed instructions for the 2nd round, it will be announced through the website.

2. Secondly, I would like to ask for the purpose of the model. As this is an urban scheme at a large scale, I wonder how useful a model will be in representing the projects. Especially apparent in our selected project, even though it has some vertical elements and variations, when created as a small scale model, we are worried it will look flat. Otherwise, the model will become too big in order to begin showing some information. Furthermore, making the model will cost all of the student entrants some fee in terms of material and crafting if some projects need to use machines such as laser cutter or 3D printer. Is it possible to replace it with computer renderings? The rendering can be manipulated in such a way that it will look like a physical model or it can be more of a photo-montage or photo-realistic rendering that can convey more information about the projects.

- ⇒ No, you cannot replace model photos with computer renderings
- 3. Thirdly, I would like to ask about the travels to Seoul in order to present the projects. We are curious as to how much we will get for visa application, flight, and accommodation. In the brief, it says that each foreign contestant team will receive part of the accommodation. In this case, it would be great to know the amount so that we may be able to book our trip earlier to possibly lower the cost.
 - ⇒ We will provide each team from foreign countries with a part of flight and accommodation expenses. Currently, we have a budget of 2,300,000won(KRW) for each team from foreign countries.
